Klaas Verplancke is a worldwide acclaimed speaker, lecturer, jury member, curator, author & illustrator of over 150 books published in more then 30 languages and 60 translations. He won a **Bologna Ragazzi Award**, was a top five finalist for the **Hans Christian Andersen Awards** and received 13 consecutive nominations for the **Astrid Lindgren Memorial Award**.

His most recent picture book <u>Magritte's Apple</u> was commissioned and published by MoMA, The Museum of Modern Art, New York and Centre Pompidou, Paris.

He also works for international magazines and newspapers, such as <u>The New Yorker</u> and <u>The New York</u> and <u>The New York</u> and <u>The New York</u> and has been selected for the annual competitions organised by American Illustration, Society of Illustrators, AOI & 3x3 magazine, that awarded him a Gold medal in the PRO SHOW 2018.

His qualities as an independent visual and text creator led to exhibitions in Belgium and abroad, international invitations as a jury member (Bologna Illustrator Exhibition, Bologna Ragazzi Digital Award and currently for Nami Concours 2018, Korea, Silent Books 2019 and the International Award of Illustration Bologna Children's Book Fair 2019), as a guest lecturer (Itabashi Museum Summer School Tokyo, Japan and MIMASTER Milano) and as a key note speaker (USBBY Congress in Chicago and St Louis, USA).

Klaas Verplancke is also a professor at The Royal Academy of Fine Arts in Antwerp, Belgium.

At first glance, Verplancke's drawings and paintings differ a great deal in appearance and execution. But they always display the qualities that characterize him as an illustrator, animator and designer: a sense of humor that can vary from mild to sardonic, a poetic imagination, a preference for illustrating abstract concepts and universal emotions – and a sideways, surrealistic view of reality.
